

## GRAFTED PECAN TREES

The Kentucky Bluegrass Chapter of the Soil and Water Conservation Society is offering a very limited supply of grafted pecan trees for sale through spring 2008. These trees are on northern pecan rootstock and are well suited for home and farm planting in central Kentucky. They are approximately 2' to 4', and are \$30 each. Select from the following varieties:

**Major** This is an outstanding native Kentucky pecan from the Scuffletown Bottoms at the mouth of the Green River near Henderson, Kentucky. The nuts are medium sized, somewhat round, and of excellent quality. The tree produces early pollen and requires a pollinator that produces late pollen (such as Kanza).

**Kanza** This pecan was recently developed by the USDA pecan breeding program. Nuts are medium sized, mature early, and have excellent quality kernels. The tree produces late pollen and requires a pollinator that produces early pollen (such as Major or Fisher).

**Fisher** This pecan cultivar is originally from Illinois. It is a good northern pecan, has excellent quality kernels, and ripens early. It tends to come into bearing at an earlier age than the Major pecan does. The tree produces early pollen and requires a pollinator that produces late pollen (such as Kanza)
